

## ADMISSION INFORMATION FOR BACHELOR OF SCIENCE PROGRAMS

### 1. About Bachelor of Science Programs

#### Overview

EIT's 3 year Engineering Bachelor of Science Degrees have been designed by experts from both industry and academia to ensure graduates are prepared for meaningful employment in an engineering workplace.

There are four [Bachelor of Science \(BSc\) degrees](#), each one specializing in a different engineering stream: Industrial Automation, Mechanical, Electrical, and Civil and Structural.

EIT delivers these qualifications online and at selected campus locations. Designed to impart practical skills which can be directly applied in the workplace, these courses are facilitated by experienced engineers, who are experts in their industry.

Students may be awarded credit for units as a result of previously completed qualifications or professional experience.

### 2. Essential Requirements for Admission

Entry is available to applicants who hold:

- Year 12: Australian Senior Certificate of Education (or [equivalent](#)), completed within the past 2 years, with the following level of achievement in Maths:
  - **WA** – WACE scaled score of 50.0 or more.
  - **ACT** – a scaled mark of 125 or more
  - **NSW** – performance Band 2 or above
  - **QLD** – a level of Sound Achievement (S) or above
  - **SA/NT** – a grade of C- or higher or a Subject achievement score of 10 or more
  - **TAS** – an award of Satisfactory Achievement or above
  - **VIC** – a study score of 25 or above

Applicants who have completed Yr 12 (or [equivalent](#)) more than 2 years ago will also need to show relevant work experience in the field of study applied for; OR

- A relevant (to the sub-discipline) Engineering AQF Diploma, Advanced Diploma, Associate Degree (or higher) with successful completion of all Maths units/modules; OR
- An overseas qualification equivalent to the above item from a structured program of learning that leads to the full or partial achievement of an officially accredited qualification undertaken at a tertiary institution such as a university, government technical college, or government recognized private college (EIT assesses overseas qualifications using Australian Government guidelines to determine their comparability to qualifications); OR
- International Baccalaureate (IB) Completion with a minimum score of 24 including English and Maths completion; OR
- Foundation studies or bridging course completion in a relevant discipline with completion of Mathematics and English. e.g. Engineering enabling course; AND
- Satisfactory English language proficiency at an English pass level in an Australian Senior Certificate of Education (or [equivalent](#)); OR
- A specified level of achievement in a recognised English language test such as: IELTS at a score of at least 6.0 (with no individual band score less than 5.5); or (or equivalent) as outlined in the [EIT Admissions Policy](#)

### Maths Bridging Test/Exam

Maths bridging test/exam (non-proctored/invigilated): to be completed by all Higher Education students (online and on-campus) during orientation week, to be administered through Moodle. If a student fails the initial test they must complete EIT's 3 week bridging course (online) and then take the test again (non-proctored/invigilated). If the student fails again they will be considered a student at risk and managed in accordance with [EIT's Student at Risk Policy](#).

### Recognition of Prior Learning and Exemptions

EIT can give you credit for units where you can demonstrate substantial prior experience or educational background. An assessment fee may apply. For more information, please see [EIT's Credit and Recognition of Prior Learning Policy](#).

**Please note:** meeting the minimum admission criteria does not guarantee entry to our programs. Applications are assessed on a case-by-case basis.

## 4. Admission Criteria

### A. Applicants with higher education study

This applies to Australian students whose highest level of study since completing secondary school is a higher education course. This includes students who are currently studying with another higher education provider and want to transfer to a course at EIT. It also applies to students who are currently studying with EIT and wish to switch to a different course. Students who have completed a bridging or enabling course with a

higher education provider are also considered to be applicants with higher education.

#### **B. Applicants with vocational education and training (VET) study**

This applies to Australian students whose highest level of study since leaving secondary school is a vocational education and training (VET) course. This includes study at a public TAFE or with another VET provider. Applicants with a VET qualification may have completed other study, such as a Year 10 or Year 12 secondary school certificate.

#### **C. Applicants with work and life experience (includes those who left secondary education more than 2 years ago)**

This applies to people who completed secondary school more than two years ago and have not undertaken any further study with a VET provider or higher education institution.

#### **D. Applicants with recent secondary education (within the past two years)**

This applies to Australian students who have completed Year 12 (or equivalent) within the last two years, or completed their secondary education studies with a VET provider in the same timeframe. This includes students who have completed their studies interstate or overseas.

## **5. How to apply**

1. Please ensure you are eligible to study your desired course by reading the specific entry requirements available on the individual course pages available at [www.eit.edu.au](http://www.eit.edu.au)
2. Complete the enquiry form on the course page
3. You will receive an email with relevant course information and a link to apply online for your course
4. An EIT Course Advisor will give you a call to discuss your needs and answer any of your questions
5. Wait for your offer - once you have submitted your application, the EIT Admissions Team will assess your application, which will take approximately 7 working days\*. During this time period you will be notified if further documents are required.
6. Receive your offer - if your application is successful, you will receive a Letter of Offer.
7. Review and accept your Letter of Offer - once you have reviewed your Letter of Offer you will need to submit your acceptance by the specified due date.

*\*Please note that this is an estimate. Applications will differ on a case by case basis depending on course specifics.*

## **6. Advanced standing/credit transfer/recognition of prior learning (RPL)**

You may be entitled to credit for prior learning, whether formal or informal. Formal learning can include previous study in higher education, vocational education, or adult and community education. Informal learning can include on the job learning or various kinds of work and life experience. Credit can reduce the amount of study needed to complete a degree.
